## **BUSINESS RESILIENCE SCHEME**

This Business Resilience Scheme was adopted by the Council at its Meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2021. To be reviewed May 2026.

## Introduction

Woore Parish Council 1ecognizes the importance of Business Resilience to maintain the ability to deliver the activities/services expected of the Council. Risk Management is a factor that enables the Council to satisfy its objective to deliver high quality services.

## **Business Resilience Policy**

The Business Resilience Policy of the Council is to be fully committed to effective Risk Management, adopting best practices in the identification, evaluation and control of risks, in order to:

- Integrate risk management into the culture of the Council
- Eliminate or reduce risks to an acceptable level
- Anticipate and respond to changing social, environmental and legislative requirements
- Prevent injury and damage and reduce the cost of risk
- Raise awareness of the need for Risk Management

## Approach to Risk Management

The Council's approach to Risk Management requires that all risks should be systemically identified and managed in the most cost-effective manner within the overall resources available. The Council will review on-going risks annually, in May each year.

In the Risk Assessment document, the Council will:

- Take steps to identify and update the record of key risks facing the Council
- Evaluate the potential consequences to the Council if an event identified as a risk takes place
- Decide upon appropriate measures to avoid, reduce or control the risk or its consequences, and
- Record any conclusions or decisions reached
- For 'one off' or periodic events individual risk assessments shall be part of the event planning
- Evaluate the risk within one of the following three categories:
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Areas where there may be scope to use insurance to help manage risk
  - Areas where there may be scope to work with others to help manage risk
  - Areas where local councils may self-manage risk.

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
